HUTTON JOHN DUMBERLAND.

The Dele Tower at Hutton John is of very early date, rectangular, castellated, and made of rubble, the walls being in many places eight feet thick. A wing was built on to the North side of the tower in 1662. The house with all its additions forms the letter L. On the terrace are planted, equidistant, six fantastically shaped yew trees; they are named "Queen Elizabeth's Maids of Honour," and their age is said to be 300 years. Hutton John is now in the possession of James Lowther, Esq.

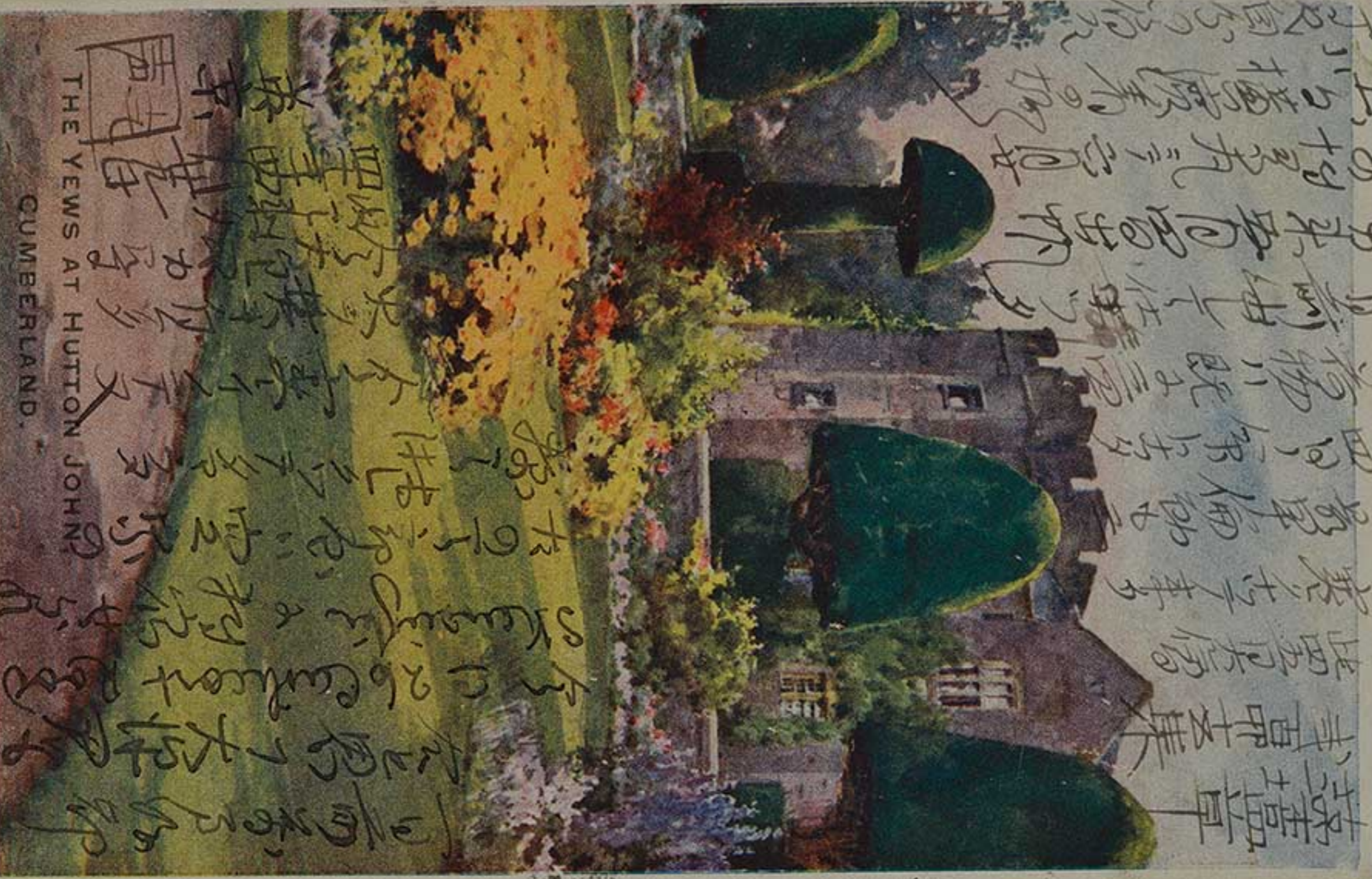
